Keith Moran from Moran Economic Development attended by zoom call to answer questions from council regarding the 12-year extension of TIF 2. TIF 2 will now expire in 2034. Surpluses to the taxing districts will be distributed starting next year. The joint review board meeting is scheduled for September 27, 2022 and the public hearing is scheduled for November 7, 2022. This TIF is the same as what was passed in 1999, nothing new has been added.

K. Approve Master Service Agreement with ABM Building Solutions for \$90,000. ABM representatives were in attendance to explain their services of looking for efficiencies by making infrastructure repairs and upgrades. The \$90,000 fee is the cost for engineering and time analysis. If council chooses to proceed with their services, this fee would be rolled into the overall work cost.

MOTION by McKinley to approve Master Service Agreement with ABM Building Solutions for \$90,000. Seconded by Friedrich. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.

- C. Ordinance 1089 an ordinance amending Chapter 51: Combined Waterworks and Sewerage System.
 - This ordinance was requested by the EPA to protect and control pollutants from systems that connect to the city's.
 - **MOTION** by McKinley to approve Ordinance 1089 an ordinance amending Chapter 51: Combined Waterworks and Sewerage System. Seconded by Friedrich. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.
- D. Ordinance 1090 an ordinance of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois authorizing the establishment of TIF "interested parties" registries and adopting registration rules for such registries for southwest redevelopment project area TIF #2.
 This ordinance will establish an interested party registry for everyone affected by TIF 2.
 - MOTION by McKinley to approve Ordinance 1090 an ordinance of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois authorizing the establishment of TIF "interested parties" registries and adopting registration rules for such registries for southwest redevelopment project area TIF #2. Seconded by Friedrich. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.

Ordinance 1091 an ordinance fixing a time and place for a public hearing in connection with proposed amendments to the redevelopment plan for southwest redevelopment project area number 2 of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois, and related matters. The public hearing date is set for November 7, 2022 6pm at city hall.
 MOTION by McKinley to approve Ordinance 1091 an ordinance fixing a time and place for a public hearing in connection with proposed amendments to the redevelopment plan for southwest redevelopment project area number 2 of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County.

 - State code states that the city has extraterritorial jurisdiction within 1 ½ miles of city limits. Since there are new easements, Moss Lake must receive approval from council.
 - **MOTION** by McKinley to approve Resolution 2022-73 a resolution concerning the replat of a replat of lots 1, 2, 4, 12 and 13 of Moss Lake Subdivision. Seconded by Friedrich. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.
- G. Approval of MFT budget.
 - The city does not have large projects to complete this year. Proposed is tree trimming, road salt, CA-6, engineering and spray patching.
 - **MOTION** by McKinley to approve MFT budget. Seconded by Friedrich. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.
- H. Approval to reject all tree removal bids.
 - The city published for bid the removal of 6 trees and 9 stumps. 7 bid packets were sent to area contractors in the hope that there would be some savings. 3 packets were received. The lowest bid, by Yeagle Forestry, was still more than \$8000 over the budgeted amount for the year.
 - **MOTION** by McKinley to reject all tree removal bids. Seconded by Friedrich. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.
- I. Discussion regarding proposed amendments to the Vacant Property Registry Ordinance. Since implementation, there have been issues arise regarding the vacant property registry. CM McLaughlin is asking council for their direction on 5 items in order to bring back an amended ordinance at the next council meeting. The most significant change is to allow for intermittently vacant properties to be exempt due to "snow bird" type situations and others.

J. Discussion about Christmas tree lighting.
CM McLaughlin is asking council what direction they would like to take regarding the Christmas tree lighting this year. She will be reaching out to the Chamber of Commerce and Ryan Peyton with Schneider Elementary for their input also. Council suggested Santa, hot chocolate and cookies. They also expressed interest in getting the children involved; maybe even allowing them to share turning on the lights with the parade grand marshal.

RE: Water ordinance amendment

There are a couple of homes, outside the city, to which we provide city water. However, those houses have very long service lines to reach the main where it currently sits.

The Illinois EPA has mandated that we either extend the watermain to allow for those houses to have shorter, separate service lines or adjust our ordinance requiring that separation. Our current ordinance states, "A separate, and independent building water main..." We are recommending an amendment to state, "A separate, and independent water service pipe..."

This is an acceptable amendment, per the EPA, to the ordinance so that we don't have to pay \$150,000 to extend a watermain to service residences outside our limits. Staff recommends approval.

Ordinance No. 1092

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 51: Combined Waterworks and Sewerage System

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council (the "Corporate Authorities") of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois (the "City") desire to set rules and regulations for the City's sewerage system that promote the health, safety and welfare of the community; and certain amendments will promote the health, safety and welfare of the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMER CITY, DEWITT COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1. Amend Section 51.125.</u> Section 51.125 of Chapter 51, entitled "Combined Waterworks and Sewerage System" is hereby further supplemented and amended to read as follows:

§ 51.125 SEPARATE WATER SERVICE REQUIRED; EXCEPTION.

A separate, and independent water service pipe shall be provided for every building, except where one building stands at the rear of another on an interior lot and no water service pipe is available or can be constructed to the rear building through an adjoining alley, court, yard, or driveway, the water service pipe from the front building may be extended to the rear building and the whole considered as one building water main.

- <u>Section 2.</u> <u>Invalidity.</u> Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared to be invalid, that decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective immediately following its passage, approval and publication as required by law. For any penalty imposed by this Ordinance, said sections shall become effective 10 days following its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
- <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Conflict</u>. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.
- <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Publication</u>. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form immediately after passage.

Ordinance No. 1093

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 97: Registration and Maintenance of Vacant Structures and Properties

WHEREAS, the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois (the "City") previously adopted Chapter 97: Registration and Maintenance of Vacant Structures and Properties (the "Ordinance") to the City of Farmer City Code that regulates vacant properties in town as adopted by the Mayor and the City Council (the "Corporate Authorities") of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the City desire to amend the Ordinance to make it more clear regarding exemptions and other minor matters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMER CITY, DEWITT COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. Amend definition of "vacant". The definition of "vacant" in section 97.01 in Chapter 97 of the Farmer City Code, entitled "Registration and Maintenance of Vacant Structures and Properties", be and the same is hereby further supplemented and amended to read as follows:

Vacant: Vacant means a structure that is:

- (a) lacking the habitual presence of human beings, who have a legal right to be on the premises, for ninety (90) consecutive days; or;
- (b) a structure at which substantially all lawful business or construction activity or residential occupancy has ceased, or;
- (c) which is substantially devoid of contents, or;
- (d) a multi-family residential property when ninety percent (90%) of the dwelling units are unoccupied.

For the purposes of this chapter, exceptions to the definition of vacant shall be made for properties that are actively listed for sale with a licensed realtor and for those properties which are under active, ongoing rehabilitation or reconstruction and have a current building permit issued by the appropriate jurisdiction, if required; and (ii) single family, owner occupied residences where the owners are temporarily absent because the owner temporarily resides at an alternative address for a portion of the year, but the property is secured and in full compliance with all other City ordinances and regulations.

<u>Section 2. Amend Section 97.05.</u> Section 97.05 in Chapter 97 of the Farmer City Code, entitled "Registration and Maintenance of Vacant Structures and Properties", be and the same is hereby further supplemented and amended to read as follows:

§97.05 -- VACANT STRUCTURE REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE

- (a) Application by the owner of a vacant structure for a vacant structure certificate shall be made on a form provided by the City. The application shall include a "statement of intent" which will set forth information as to:
 - 1) the expected period of vacancy (including the date of initial vacancy);
- 2) the plan for regular maintenance during the vacancy to comply with the vacant structure maintenance standards of this subsection and all of the applicable property maintenance, building and nuisance codes of the City;
- 3) a plan and time line for the lawful occupancy, rehabilitation, removal or demolition of the structure;
- 4) measures to be taken to ensure that the structure will be kept weather tight and secure from trespassers and that it will be safe for entry by police officers, firefighters and code or building inspectors in time of exigent circumstances or emergency as well as at times of reasonable inspection as provided in Section 97.06 below;
- 5) measures to be taken to assure that the premises remain free from nuisance conditions and in good order in conformance with the vacant structure maintenance standards; and
- 6) list all persons authorized to be present in the structure and provide notices of trespass to the police authorizing the arrest for trespass of individuals not on the list (The owner shall update the authorized person list as needed).
- (b) No Vacant Structure Registration Certificate shall be effective for more than six months from the date of issuance. Upon a showing of demonstrated need, up to two (2) six-month renewals may be granted by the City Manager. Renewals beyond 18 months may granted by the City Manager upon showing of extraordinary need and circumstances.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Amend Section 97.10.</u> Section 97.10 in Chapter 97 of the Farmer City Code, entitled "Registration and Maintenance of Vacant Structures and Properties", be and the same is hereby further supplemented and amended to read as follows:

§97.10 -- ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

- (a) Any person found to be in violation of any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a minimum fine of \$150, not to exceed \$750. Each day that said violation continues shall be considered a new and separate violation. Prosecution under this section is a remedy cumulative to any and all other remedies at law and equity, including but not limited to the City's remedies under 65 ILCS 5/11-13-15.
- (b) All fees, costs or charges assessed or incurred by the City pursuant to this chapter shall be a lien upon the real property. The lien shall be superior to all subsequent liens and encumbrances. The City Attorney shall file a notice of lien, within six (6) months after such cost and expense is incurred, in the office of the DeWitt County Recorder of Deeds. The lien may be enforced by proceeding to foreclose, as in case of mortgages or mechanic's liens.
- (c) At the expiration of eighteen (18) months from the original issuance of the Vacant Structure Registration Certificate, the structure must be actively for sale, reoccupied, removed or demolished. Any structure which is vacant beyond the eighteen (18) month maximum registration period shall be considered abandoned and a public nuisance and the City may pursue whatever legal action is afforded to it by law for the removal and/or abatement of public nuisance.
- <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Invalidity.</u> Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared to be invalid, that decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
- <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective immediately following its passage, approval and publication as required by law. For any penalty imposed by this Ordinance, said sections shall become effective 10 days following its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
- <u>Section 6.</u> Conflict. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.
- <u>Section 7.</u> <u>Publication</u>. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form immediately after passage.

Attached is a scope of service from Prairie Engineers to design engineer and apply for an ITEP grant for a sidewalk along Rt. 54. This sidewalk is contemplated in the new Sidewalk Master Plan from Main St and Rt. 54 east to Casey's on the south side of the route.

When applying for an ITEP grant, the project must be engineered and ready to go when applying, which is why we missed the deadline for this year. This will allow the engineers to design the project and prepare a grant application for the 2023 year. Even if we do not receive this grant, it will be engineered and ready to go for another grant application or funding.

We do have money budgeted for such a project through Business District and Forward TIF funds, although all \$75,000 will probably not be expended in FY 23. Staff recommends approval.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Invoices: Charges for services will be billed at least as frequently as monthly, and at the completion of the Project. CLIENT shall compensate Prairie Engineers, P.C. (PRAIRIE) for any sales or value added taxes which apply to the services rendered under this agreement or any addendum thereto. CLIENT shall reimburse PRAIRIE for the amount of such taxes in addition to the compensation due for services. Payment of invoices shall not be subject to any discounts or set-offs by the CLIENT unless agreed to in writing by PRAIRIE. Invoices are delinquent if payment has not been received within 30 days from date of invoice. There will be an additional charge of 1 1/2 percent per month compounded on amounts outstanding more than 30 days. All time spent and expenses incurred (including attorney's fees) in connection with collection of any delinquent amount will be paid by CLIENT to PRAIRIE per PRAIRIE's current fee schedules.
- 2. Termination: This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice. Any termination shall only be for good cause such as legal, unavailability of adequate financing or major changes in the scope of services. - 5. General Liability Insurance and Limitation: PRAIRIE is covered by general liability insurance for bodily injury and property damage arising directly from its negligent acts or

- omissions, with limits which PRAIRIE considers reasonable. Certificates of insurance shall be provided to CLIENT upon request in writing. Within the limits and conditions of such insurance, PRAIRIE agrees to indemnify and save CLIENT harmless from any loss, damage or liability arising directly from any negligent act or omission by PRAIRIE. PRAIRIE shall not be responsible for any loss, damage or liability beyond the amounts, limits and conditions of such insurance. PRAIRIE shall not be responsible for any loss, damage or liability arising from any act or omission by CLIENT, its agents, staff, other consultants, independent contractors, third parties or others working on the Project over which PRAIRIE has no supervision or control.
- 6. Suspension of Services: If CLIENT fails to make payments when due or otherwise is in breach of this Agreement, PRAIRIE may suspend performance of services upon five (5) calendar days' notice to CLIENT. PRAIRIE shall have no liability whatsoever to CLIENT, and CLIENT agrees to make no claim for any delay or damage as a result of such suspension.
- 7. Consequential Damages: Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, and to the fullest extent permitted by law, neither CLIENT nor PRAIRIE, their respective officers, directors, partners, employees, contractors or subconsultants shall be liable to the other or shall make any claim for incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of or connected in any way to this Project or this Agreement. This mutual waiver of consequential damages shall include, but not be limited to, loss of use, loss of profit, loss of business, loss of income, loss of reputation and any other consequential damages that either party may have incurred from any cause of action including negligence, strict liability, breach of contract and breach of strict and implied warranty. CLIENT must notify PRAIRIE in writing, before PRAIRIE commences any services, of CLIENT's intention to negotiate a greater limitation of remedies against PRAIRIE and its associated impact on services. schedules, and compensation. Absent CLIENT's written notification to the contrary, PRAIRIE will proceed on the basis that the total remedies against PRAIRIE is limited as set forth above.
- 10. Personal Liability: It is intended by the parties to this Agreement that PRAIRIE's services in connection with the Project shall not subject PRAIRIE's individual employees, officers or directors to any personal legal exposure for the risks associated with this Project. Therefore, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Client agrees that as the Client's sole and exclusive remedy, any claim, demand or suit shall be directed and/or asserted only against PRAIRIE, an Illinois corporation, and not against any of PRAIRIE's individual employees, officers or directors.
- 11. Assignment: Neither party to this Agreement shall transfer, sublet, or assign any rights or duties under or interest in this Agreement, including but not limited to monies that are due or monies that may become due, without the written consent of the other party. Subcontracting to subconsultants, normally contemplated by PRAIRIE as generally accepted business practice, shall not be considered an assignment for purposes of this Agreement.

Dispute Resolution: In an effort to resolve any conflicts that arise during the design and construction of this Project or following completion of this Project, the CLIENT and PRAIRIE agree that all disputes between them arising out of or relating to this Agreement or this Project shall be submitted to nonbinding mediation.

Authority and Responsibility: PRAIRIE shall not guarantee the work of any Contractor or Subcontractor, shall have no authority to stop work, shall have no supervision or control as to the work or persons doing the work, shall not have charge of the work, and shall not be responsible for safety in, on, or about the job site or have any control of the safety or adequacy of any equipment, building component, scaffolding, supports, forms or other work aids.
- 15. Right of Entry: CLIENT shall provide for PRAIRIE's right to enter property owned by CLIENT and/or others in order for PRAIRIE to fulfill the scope of services for this Project. CLIENT understands that use of exploration equipment may unavoidably cause some damage, the correction of which is not the responsibility of PRAIRIE.
- 16. Utilities: CLIENT shall be responsible for designating the location of all utility lines and subterranean structures within the property line of the Project. CLIENT agrees to waive any claim against PRAIRIE, and to defend, indemnify and hold harmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss arising from PRAIRIE or other persons encountering utilities or other man-made objects that were not called to PRAIRIE's attention or which were not properly located on plans furnished to PRAIRIE. CLIENT further agrees to compensate PRAIRIE for any time or expenses incurred by PRAIRIE in defense of any such claim, in accordance with PRAIRIE's prevailing fee schedule and expense reimbursement policy.
- 17. Job Site: Services performed by PRAIRIE during construction will be limited to providing assistance in quality control and to deal with questions by the CLIENT's representative concerning conformance with drawings and specifications. This activity is not to be interpreted as an inspection service, a construction supervision service, or guaranteeing the Contractor's performance. PRAIRIE will not be responsible for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures, or for safety precautions and programs. PRAIRIE will not be responsible for the Contractor's obligation to carry out the work in accordance with the Contract Documents. PRAIRIE will not be considered an agent of the owner and will not have authority to direct the Contractor's work or to stop work.

- 18. Opinions of Cost: Since PRAIRIE has no control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment or over a Contractor's method of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, its opinions of probable Project cost or construction cost for this Project will be based solely upon its own experience with construction, but PRAIRIE cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids or the construction cost will not vary from its opinions of probable costs. If the CLIENT wishes greater assurance as to the construction cost, he shall employ an independent cost estimator.
- 19. Shop Drawing Review: CLIENT agrees that PRAIRIE's review of shop drawings, when such review is included in the scope of services, shall be solely for their conformance with PRAIRIE's design intent and conformance with information given in the construction documents. PRAIRIE shall not be responsible for any aspects of a shop drawing submission that affect or are affected by the means, methods, techniques, sequences and operations of construction, safety precautions and programs incidental thereto, all of which are the Contractor's responsibility. The Contractor will be responsible for lengths, dimensions, elevations, quantities and coordination of the work with other trades. CLIENT warrants that the Contractor shall be made aware of his responsibilities to review shop drawings and approve them in these respects before submitting them to PRAIRIE.
- 20. Confidentiality: Each party shall retain as confidential, all information and data furnished to it by the other party which are designated in writing by such other party as confidential at the time of transmission and are obtained or acquired by the receiving party in connection with this Agreement and said party shall not disclose such information to any third party.

RE: Drainage ditch/tributary maintenance

Regarding the clearing and maintenance of the drainage ditch/tributary that runs through town. Now that we know that the jurisdiction for this maintenance is on each property owner, I reached out to multiple companies recommended by the Illinois Drainage District Association for quotes.


I only received one response, Aquaterre, out of Strawn, Illinois. He met with Fred and me and also walked the length of tributary and prepared a quote for us. He broke it down into sections, with pictures and costs for each section. The total for the work from October 2022 through spring of 2023 is \$33,376.20. I have attached a breakdown of the cost for each section. Descriptions of the work are included, with pictures, in his quote. He comes highly recommended and maintains miles of tributaries for jurisdictions around central Illinois.

There are 30 property owners adjacent to this tributary, some have larger portions than others, such as the School District and Woodlawn Country Club. Since we have a discussed a Special Service Area to cover the cost of cleaning and maintenance, we need to decide how to spread out the cost. Do we charge for length of tributary frontage? Do we charge per section of work? Do we charge the whole city or just those adjacent to the tributary?

We could afford to start the work this fall, which I highly recommend, to avoid flooding in the spring. We could then discuss options on how to recoup the cost since creating an SSA will take a few months.






