- A. Approval of the minutes of the May 1, 2023 council meeting.

MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve consent agenda. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Discussion regarding leaf burning ban.
 - City Manager McLaughlin had sent the survey results of the leaf burning questions to council beforehand. Citizens were in overwhelming agreement that they want to keep leaf burning in the city. Mayor Testory states that he would like to see more police enforcement of the "off day" burning.
- B. Ordinance 1102 making annual appropriations for the City of Farmer City for FY 2023-24. This is required as part of the budget process. Appropriations locks the city into maximum spending limits. Since Farmer City is currently under 2000 residents, no hearing is required.
 MOTION by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve Ordinance 1102 making annual appropriations for the City of Farmer City for FY 2023-24. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.
- C. Approve payout #1 to Stark Excavating in the amount of \$204,381.14 for the Prairie Ridge playground parking lot.
 - This payout is an extra \$18,000 from the original bid. The contractors had rolled the area and 2 different areas gave way. It is believed the area had been filled with spoils. CM McLaughlin reached out to Gibson Area Hospital to see if they would help financially with the extra expense and they declined. The Hospital did contribute \$2957.50 to cover the cost of thicker concrete under the dumpster that they had requested.
 - **MOTION** by McKinley, seconded by Friedrich, to approve payout #1 to Stark Excavating in the amount of \$204,381.14 for the Prairie Ridge playground parking lot. Voted unanimously. Motion carried.
- D. Discussion regarding digital sign policy.
 - The Chamber of Commerce has requested city manager McLaughlin attend their meeting this week and discuss updates and policies relating to a digital sign. McLaughlin is asking council what they

would like her to relay to the Chamber. Council is unsure of what their policy and intentions will be and would like her to ask Chamber what they are wanting regarding usage and cost.

The next project will be to bid out the oil and chip South Park drive and design the dog park. The YMCA is doing a good job at managing the pool.

Councilman McKinley mentioned he was contacted regarding fireworks for Nate Days. He wanted to inform council of it this year as they were not contacted last year. Council was in agreement that fireworks could be set off.

RE: Crossing Guard

As you'll recall during budget discussions, our Crossing Guard fund has continued to decline. This is due to the increasing cost to meet the minimum wage in Illinois as well as the statutory limit to our property tax for crossing guard funds.

Beginning this fiscal year, we estimate the fund will go into the red. We reached out to the school district to determine their stake in the cost to fund a crossing guard. The school board voted to approve helping to fund the guard's position at a rate of 30% of the annual cost. This will be approximately \$2,550 based on this year's budget. This amount will keep the fund from going into a deficit, but only for the next year, maybe two.

If you agree with this offer, attached is a resolution approving the intergovernmental agreement with the school district for this contribution.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

This work shall consist of placing and grading aggregate, priming, sealing, furnishing and placing seal coat aggregate on South Park Drive within the City of Farmer City.

PROSECUTION AND PROGRESS

No material shall be applied and spread after September 30, 2023 unless approved by the City

AGGREGATE SURFACE COURSE, TYPE B

CA 6 aggregate will be placed and graded to fill in any existing dips. Prior to priming the entire roadway surface will be rolled to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

APPLICATION OF BITUMINOUS SURFACE TREATMENT A-3

This work shall conform Check Sheet LRS #9 and the following:

The pressure distributor and aggregate spreader shall be capable of covering the entire lane width in one pass.

Rolling shall be required. There shall be a minimum of two rollers, with the final number of rollers determined by the rollers' abilities to maintain proper spacing with the aggregate spreader as directed by the Engineer.

Only single axle or tandem axle haul trucks will be allowed on the roadways for hauling of the seal coat aggregate. Larger trucks will be allowed only for the hauling and applying the bituminous seal coat material.

Sweeping and picking up excess seal coat aggregate after application and removal from the jobsite no earlier than seven (7) calendar days and no later than fourteen (14) calendar days after placement of the seal coat aggregate. All loose aggregate removed at this time shall be the property of the City and shall be transported to the City's street garage at 210 E. Monroe Street and store it as directed by the City. The Contractor shall coordinate with the City of Farmer City Street Department – Fred Graning prior to delivery. He can be reached at (309) 825-8655.

Bituminous Materials (Prime Coat) at 0.5 gallons per square yard and will be paid at the contract unit price per gallon. Payment will not be made for bituminous materials in excess of 105 percent of the amount specified by the engineer.

Bituminous Materials Cover and Seal Coat - CRS-2P or HFRS-2P for two lifts of 5/8" at 0.5 gallons per square yards and top lift of 3/8" at 0.45 gallons per square yard and will be paid at the contract unit price per gallon. Payment will not be made for bituminous materials in excess of 105 percent of the amount specified by the engineer.

Cover and Seal Aggregate Materials - Two lifts of CA-14 (5/8") Class A quality chips at 25 pounds per square yards and top lift of CA-16 (3/8") Class A quality chips at 25 pounds per square yard and will be paid at the contract unit price per ton except measurement for payment will not be made for aggregate in excess of 110 percent of the amount specified by the engineer.

ALTERNATE BID

Bituminous Materials Cover and Seal Coat - CRS-2P or HFRS-2P for two lifts of 5/8" at 0.5 gallons per square yards and top lift of 3/8" at 0.45 gallons per square yard and will be paid at the contract unit price per gallon. Payment will not be made for bituminous materials in excess of 105 percent of the amount specified by the engineer.

Cover and Seal Aggregate Materials - Two lifts of CA-14 (5/8") pea gravel at 25 pounds per square yards and top lift of CA-16 (3/8") pea gravel at 25 pounds per square yard and will be paid at the contract unit price per ton except measurement for payment will not be made for aggregate in excess of 110 percent of the amount specified by the engineer.

All materials must be IDOT approved.

The aggregate shall be free of foreign material at the time of application and the Engineer/Client has the right to reject any aggregate which contains excessive foreign material.

The Contractor and his materials supplier shall insure that the seal coat aggregate and the emulsion do not have the same charge (i.e. cationic to cationic) for successful binding of the emulsion to the aggregates.

Aggregates used for cover and seal coat shall contain no free moisture.

Protection of utility structures and adjacent streets/alleys/sidewalks not to receive bituminous surface treatment shall be to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

Contractor shall contact the City at least 72 hours prior to seal coating.

The City should be consulted before changing the application rates or altering the width or length of a street.

The Contractor shall provide the City the sources of the seal coat materials for approval at least 72 hours before delivery of the material to complete the seal coat work.

"No Parking" signs shall be posted at least 24 hours in advance of operations on any street or street segment as needed and removed promptly at the completion of seal coating.

The above work will not be paid for separately, but shall be included in the costs of the contract pay items.





RE: FY 24 Road Resurfacing

Attached is the map indicating the streets that were approved in the budget to mill and overlay this year. They include parts of West Green, South William, Dodge St and Ogle Drive.

These streets were chosen for their condition, but also because there is no water or sewer that needs to be replaced underneath the pavement as well as for their location, which provides us the ability to spread the cost across funds (General Fund, Business District and TIF Districts)

Total estimated cost is just over \$75,000. The Crabtree resurfacing will be added to this bid, but paid out of MFT funds. Staff recommends approval.

RE: Property Maintenance

The Police Department has been doing a good job in trying to keep up with code enforcement around town utilizing our existing ordinances. However, we believe adding some property maintenance language as well as other nuisance explanations would be helpful to enforcement.

Attached is a draft ordinance which provides for the following:

- Adds language regarding carports, garages
- Adds language regarding storage of vehicles on porches and balconies
- Adds language regarding the storage of materials
- Add a section to address dangerous and unsightly buildings
 - o Makes nuisance of dangerous property
 - o Makes nuisance of buildings in disrepair
- Adds language specifying weeds & vegetation reasons

We believe this will provide the teeth necessary to enforce some buildings that are in disrepair without adopting the full building code. Therefore, staff recommends approval.

Ordinance

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 91: Nuisances; Abandoned Vehicles

Whereas, the City of Farmer City desires to have properties maintained in a clean and safe conditions; and

Deleted: ¶

Whereas, the City Council for the City of Farmer City <u>desires to bolster</u> the existing nuisance ordinance by adding conditions to its <u>definition of nuisances</u>; and

Whereas; it is the intent of this Ordinance to <u>enhance the nuisance</u> <u>ordinance by adding definitions of dangerous buildings, weeds and other conditions;</u>

NOW, Therefore, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Farmer City that Chapter 91: Nuisances; Abandoned Vehicles is hereby amended as follows, to-wit:

Article I - Amend Chapter 91.17 by adding the following conditions:

- (O) Conditions that are defined as a nuisance in this chapter located within a carport if the conditions are visible to the public from any public right of way;
- (P) Conditions that are defined as a nuisance in this chapter and are located in an open garage if the conditions are visible to the public from any public right of way;
- (Q) Storage of motorized vehicles with over 400cc motor on front porches, back porches and balconies if the motorized vehicle is visible to the public from any public right of way;
- (R) The keeping or storage of building supplies, construction materials, landscaping materials, salvageable metals, lumber, bricks or blocks outside of a building, garage or shed, except, if kept in an orderly or organized fashion. The keeping and storage of such materials shall be allowed during the construction and remodeling of a structure or property, but the items shall not be kept or stored_outside of a building, garage or shed longer than three months_v

Article II - Add Section 91.20 as follows, to-wit:

Deleted: outside of a building, garage or shed and if kept in an orderly or organized fashion.

Section 91.20 - Dangerous and/or Unsightly Buildings

A. Any building, structure, or part thereof or any premises within the corporate limits of the City, by reason of faulty construction, lack of repair, age, excavation or any other cause which shall be in such condition as to endanger the life or limb of persons passing by or near the same or

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residing or being in the vicinity thereof or endangering any property contiguous thereto or being attractive to children and endangering the life or limb of children is hereby declared a nuisance and danger to public safety.__

- B. Any building, structure, or part thereof or any premises within the corporate limits of the City, by reason of faulty construction, lack of repair, age, excavation or any other cause which shall be unsightly as to cause values of property in immediate area to be adversely affected including but not limited to exteriors with excessive loose or peeling or missing paint, chimney and other exterior masonry damaged or missing bricks or mortar, gutt3ers not secured to the building or not free flowing, roofs not free of leaks or showing significant deterioration, siding, trim, windows and doors not maintained in a weather-tight condition free of rotted wood, not maintained fences, storage sheds, walkways and other exterior structures
- C. The owner of the building, structure or part thereof or the premises upon which any excavation has been made which is attractive to children and dangerous to their life or limb shall abate said nuisance by the razing of the building, structure or part thereof to the ground level, or by rebuilding or repairing said building, structure or part thereof in accordance with building restrictions so as to eliminate all danger to public safety or adversity to surrounding property values, and in the event of excavations on premises shall cover the same and eliminate the conditions attractive to children, so as to eliminate all danger to public safety.

Article III - Amending Section 91.30 by adding the following, to-wit:

For the purpose of this section, weeds and vegetation declared a nuisance includes, but is not limited to, that which:

- Harbors or aids in harboring rats, snakes or vermin;
- Harbors or hosts diseases or insects which may reasonably be expected to injure other forms of life;
- Which by reason of its location or condition constitutes an imminent danger to any person or property;
- Which covers or hinders the removal of accumulation of junk, garbage and debris;
- e. may include tree saplings less than 8 inches in height

Article IV -Section 91.31 is deleted in its entirety and the following is inserted in its place:

It shall be unlawful for anyone to permit any weeds, grass, plants, to grow to a height exceeding 8 inches. Any such weeds, grass or plants exceeding the height are hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Article V – Amending Section 91.31 by adding the following underlined:

It shall be unlawful for anyone to permit any weeds, grass or plants, other than trees specifically planted by the property owner and not growing wildly, bushes,

Deleted: other than trees, bushes, flowers or other ornamental plants to grow to a height

Deleted: anywhere in the cit

flowers or other ornamental plants to grow to a height exceeding 8 inches anywhere in the City, any such weeds, grass or plants exceeding the height are hereby declared to be a nuisance.

RE: Dumpster ordinance

Due to a recent spate of dumpsters being placed on local streets, the Chief and I realized we needed to have an ordinance regulating their placement and length of stay.

We are proposing the attached draft dumpster ordinance which regulates the length of stay and locations in the right-of-way. It also regulates the length of time a dumpster or similar device can be placed, which we are proposing to be 30 days. A permit would also be required of \$20.

We believe this will help us oversee the use of dumpsters and "PODS" within city limits, especially relative to downtown, intersections and narrow streets.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023 -

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County,
Illinois. an Illinois municipal corporation, have determined that it is appropriate, in order to
provide for the improvement of the public's health. safety, and welfare, that Ordinance 2023-
adding Section to Chapter of the Municipal Code of Farmer City, Illinois be added.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Farmer City, DeWitt County, Illinois, in lawful meeting assembled as follows:
Dumpsters and Portable Storage Devices in Public Rights-of-Way or Crossing Public Rights-of-Way shall be added to Chapter of the Code of Farmer City, and shall read as follows:
Sec Dumpster and Portable Storage Devices in Public Rights-of-Way or Crossing Public Rights-of Way.
A. Purpose
The primary purpose of public streets is for use by vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Reasonable regulations of obstruction in public streets and sidewalks is necessary to

B. Definitions

Dumpster means a metal storage receptacle used to temporarily store debris or garbage, and which is then emptied of its contents or remove with its contents to a dumpsite.

protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

Portable Storage Device means any item placed in a street that is not a motor vehicle as defined by the Illinois Vehicle Code, or a temporary dumpster, including, but not limited to, containers commonly known as "portable storage devices or "PODS®

Hazardous waste means a waste or combination of solid wastes which, because of its quantity, concentration or physical chemical, or infectious characteristics may cause or significantly contribute to an increase in mortality or an increase in serious, irreversible or incapacitating reversible illnesses; or pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, or disposed of, or otherwise managed or which has been identified, by characteristics or listing, as hazardous pursuant to Federal laws and their implementing regulations and State of Illinois laws and their implementing regulations. Applicable Federal laws include, but are not limited to the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (P.L. 94-580); the Toxic Substances Control Act: the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (68 Stat. 921): and the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act. State laws include but are not limited to the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

Temporary Dumpster means any dumpster used or intended as a disposal facility for construction, renovation, or demolitions projects, special events, seasonal use, or other purposes not permanent in nature.

- C. Prior to the issuance of any permit for any dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device, its location and usage shall be reviewed and approved by the Superintendent of Streets and/or Chief of Police.
- D. A permit for a dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall be for an initial term of not more than 30 days. Provided the applicant is in compliance with all provisions of this article and all other applicable City regulations, a renewal permit may be approved and issued for no more than two additional 30-day periods upon application and payment of the permit renewal fee as established by the City Council. Not more than one renewal shall be issued by the City for any dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device placed upon any City Street. The dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall be removed prior to the expiration of the permit.
- E. The following requirements shall apply to any dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device placed upon public streets or pedestrian ways in the City.
 - (1) No dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device may be placed on roads in the City, within 40 feet of an intersection; or within any prohibited or restricted area.
 - (2) Dumpsters, temporary dumpsters or portable storage devices shall be placed on a paved or gravel surface if located on private property.
 - (3) Sufficient reflective tape shall be placed upon all four sides of the dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device in such a manner as to make it visible at night.
 - (4) No dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall be placed nearer than 15 feet to any fire hydrant within the parkway or other area intended for fire-fighting equipment.
 - (5) The name, address and telephone number of the dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device owner/operator shall be conspicuously placed on at least two sides of the device.
 - (6) No dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall be placed on the parkway of any street extending a distance of more than 9 feet from the curb line or edge of the parkway.
 - (7) The location of any dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device upon any public street shall not interfere with any required clear sight distance across any intersection.
 - (8) The location of dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device upon any public street shall not obstruct any pedestrian way or the travel lane of any public street.

- (9) No dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall be loaded in such a manner as to cause its contents to spill onto any street, sidewalk, or other area intended for pedestrian travel.
- (10) No dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall contain any hazardous waste unless pursuant to a permit for such waste issued by the appropriate governmental entity.
- (11) No materials contained in a dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall emit any noxious or offensive odor or otherwise create a hazard or risk to public health.
- (12) No dumpster, temporary dumpster, or portable storage device shall be place in such a manner as to interfere with the operation or maintenance of any public utility.
- F. The permit shall be conspicuously placed in a location that permits it to be identified from a public street.
- G. The placement of any dumpster shall be in accordance with all requirements of the State of Illinois Motor Vehicle Code.
- H. If any damage or injury to the parkway, curb, sidewalk shall be caused or done by the use of occupancy of any street or road, the party to whom such permit shall have been issued shall be responsible and liable for the same and shall restore the parkway, curb and/or sidewalk to its original condition. If the permittee refuses to properly restore the parkway, curb and/or sidewalk to its original condition, the City may do so and collect the cost of the same from the permittee.
- I. The fee for a permit shall be as fixed by the council from time to time in the fee schedule.

RE: Street Garage Construction Bid

We worked with an engineer and architect to correctly create a bid packet for the construction of our new Street Maintenance Garage. We issued bids to be opened on March 28, 2023.

Both IMLRMA, our insurance carrier, and I expected bids to come in around \$300,000-400,000. However, the low bid from Building Systems of Illinois was \$758,900 and the second bid from CAD Construction was \$1,167,000.

IMLRMA advised us that their coverage EXCLUDES code upgrades. Since the original building was built decades ago, there are a number of code upgrades necessary, which the City will have to cover. Due to this fact and IMLRMA's pushback on the bid price, we have been negotiating with the contractor and IMLRMA to reduce the cost.

We are given 90 days to approve the bid, which was June 28. The winning bid, Building Systems of Illinois, agreed to extend the bid approval deadline to July 10 while we negotiated with the insurance company.

In order to preserve this bid, yet value engineer it to reduce the cost, it is recommended that you approve the original bid for \$758,900 to Building Systems of Illinois. Then, you take a second vote to approve a Change order reducing what's in the original bid to a lesser amount. This lesser amount will indicate what the City will pay for, what has been removed or reduced and what insurance will cover.
